ANNUAL REPORT TO DONORS

2014 HAD SEVERAL DEFINING MOMENTS HEIGHTENING THE ONGOING CHALLENGE OF KEEPING HOSPITAL CARE LOCAL.

APRIL 2014, our Intensive Care Unit was forced to close for 12 days when the patient monitoring system crashed, unable to be rebooted. As staff scrambled to get loaners installed and tested, donors rallied to the cause of keeping hospital care local. By December, a new patient monitoring system was both installed and paid for. A true victory for local hospital care.

JULY 2014, two Carling cottagers, Carolyn Keystone and Jim Meekison troubled by the closure of ICU, inspired and seeded a new Northern Angel Council. The Council set a goal of securing \$2.5 million in new money pledged over 5 years.

AUGUST 2014, the Parry Sound Rotary Club granted \$27,000 to the Foundation to fund the completion of a palliative care wing in the Health Centre. The new Supportive Care Unit is a sustainable solution encompassing 4 patient rooms, a living room and a dining room. The end-of-life unit provides a loving, cottage-like setting for families and patients. Staffed by Health Centre employees, the unit is juxtaposed to the Health Centre's birthing unit. The Foundation supports families by providing complimentary parking passes and cafeteria food vouchers from the Health Centre to families of palliative patients.

NOVEMBER 2014, the West Parry Sound Health Centre received the highest level of accreditation, Accreditation with Exemplary Standing. In their remarks, the accreditors noted support from Foundation donors. Equipment is key to providing standards of care and with all equipment purchased through donated dollars, donors can take a bow along with staff for the Exemplary Standing.

IN 2014, the Foundation transferred \$822,254 in donations to the Health Centre buying the ICU patient monitoring system, telemetry monitoring for cardiac rehab patients, ultrasound unit, a decontaminator washer for OR, self-administering pain pumps for patients, flexible cystoscopes, ECG for the Lab, patient lifts and patient wheel chairs.

AGAIN IN 2014, your support was instrumental in keeping hospital care local! You joined us at the Bamford's 'Get Off The Bus' concerts, pledged Richard Bernard our Housekeeping manager as he ran the perimeter of our area served, played ball hockey ... walked, ran, poled, biked or kayaked, pledged a friend, called into the Moose Radio-a-thon, played golf or simply walked into or mailed the Foundation office to donate. With your steadfast support, you played a critical role in keeping hospital care local.

Government doesn't fund equipment purchases. Donors do.

DONOR COMMUNICATIONS

ENDOWMENT - THE FOREVER FUND

The Forever Fund, revenues from the Foundation's Endowment, helps buy critical equipment year after year. Donations have come mostly through Wills, a Living Legacy of those who believed in local hospital care. The Foundation currently has \$2.600,000 in the Forever Fund. In 2014, dividends from the Forever Fund supported our patient monitoring system in ICU.

SPECIAL EVENTS

In 2014, the Foundation enjoyed tremendous success in events. The Georgian Bay Walk, Run, Pole realized revenues of \$79,803, the Support the Girls Breast Cancer Golf Tournament realized revenues of \$33,355 to help fund the ultrasound unit and our Mosey & Mosey Youth Ball Hockey realized \$19,690 for the last cystoscope to battle prostate cancer and pain pumps to relieve our palliative and surgical patients.

Going strong for 6 years our annual Moose Radio-a-thon and their loyal listeners coinciding with Richard's Run realized \$27,585 towards the patient monitoring system in ICU keeping hospital care local! Gifts through the 'Get Off the Bus Concerts' have reached \$100,000 to date!
